# **OIY CRYSTAL GEODES**

#### You will need:

Small bowl Heat-proof mixing bowl Boiling water (only adults should handle boiling water!) Salt Food coloring Eggshell (rinsed)

## Here's how:

- 1. Pour boiling water into the heat-proof mixing bowl.
- 2. Add salt into water and stir to dissolve. Add more salt until no more salt will dissolve into the water.
- 3. Add a few drops of food coloring and stir.
- 4. Place half of an eggshell into a small bowl.
- 5. Fill the small bowl with the salt water solution.
- 6. Let soak for up to a week. Crystals will form as the solution cools and water evaporates.
- 7. Observe the salt particles as they crystallize on the eggshell. You've made your own beautiful geode!
- 8. You can also try this with sugar instead of salt.
- 9. Another option is to find alum crystals and grow these on modeling clay.



#### You will need:

Chunks of broken geode or other rocks Jewelry wire (20 gauge, round, dead soft) Tool for cutting wire Ruler Glove (optional)

#### Here's how:

- 1. Make sure an adult is helping you! Use caution when using sharp tools!
- 2. Cut about 12 inches of jewelry wire with a cutting tool.
- 3. Use needle-nose pliers to create a small loop (1/4") with at least two wraps of wire, then wrap the loose end around the stem of the wire.
- 4. Wrap the wire around your rock so that it is secure.
- 5. Wrap the end of the wire just below the small loop you created in the beginning. Clip any excess wire.
- 6. Thread your favorite cord through the loop to create a necklace.
- 7. Dress to impress!
