




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
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USING YOUR BINOCULARS AND TOOLS


- 1 Bring the **binoculars** up to your eyes. Fold the **barrels** in or out to best fit the distance between your eyes.




- 2 Look through the **eyepieces** at something about 50 feet away. Fine-tune the focus by turning the **focus adjustment wheel**.



- 3 Attach the **specimen box** and the **compass** to the **strap**. You can store small things you find in the box. See below for instructions on using the compass.



- 4 You can wear the **strap** around your neck to keep the binoculars close at hand.



How to use the compass

Use the compass away from things like magnets and metal objects that might interfere. Hold the compass flat in your hand, making sure it's level. Hold it still until it stops spinning. The "N" arrow inside the compass will point toward Earth's north magnetic pole. This shows you which direction is north. The "E" points east, the "S" points south, and the "W" points west. Happy exploring!

HOW BINOCULARS WORK

WOW FACT #2
"An amazing invention"

Binoculars are like two small telescopes placed side by side.



The **hinge** allows you to adjust the distance between the **barrels**, to fit different faces.

Each barrel contains an **eyepiece lens** (or **ocular lens**) and an **objective lens**.

The objective lens is **convex**, meaning it is fatter in the middle. This shape bends light waves inward. The objective lens aims the light toward the eyepiece lens.

The eyepiece lens is **concave**, meaning it is thinner in the middle. This lens takes the image from the objective lens and **magnifies** it for the viewer to see.

The **focus adjustment wheel** changes the distance (or **focal length**) between the two lenses, allowing you to sharpen the image a bit.



Did you know that there are even more advanced binoculars out there? There are binoculars that use **prisms** to supersize their magnification power by shortening the optical path.

1	 In the fall, my acorns drop to the ground. Squirrels love to gather them for winter.				
2	 I have needles instead of leaves, and my cones often litter the ground.				
3	 My leaves are separated into three or five sections, each with pointy tips, and they change colors in the fall — from greens to yellows, oranges, and reds.				
4	 I have big, round, red fruits when ripe. I grow in vegetable gardens.				
5	 I have thorns and beautiful flowers that come in white, pink, red, and yellow.				
6	 Look for me growing near water, where my graceful branches hang down.

Clue				
1	 My bright red feathers make me easy to spot in the trees. Search for me where there are plenty of nuts and seeds.			
2	 I'm often found near water, with long legs for wading. Look for me gracefully standing on one leg in ponds and marshes.			
3	 I'm a bird of prey with a sharp beak and talons. Search for me in open fields and grasslands, where I hunt for rodents.			
4	 I am a bluish gray bird. You'll find me walking around parks in cities and towns.			
5	 I'm a social bird that hangs out in large groups. I'm all black and have a loud call.			
6	 I have a green head and a yellow bill and swim around in the water. Find me near ponds and lakes.			
7	 I am a tiny bird with wings that move so fast, you can hardly see them. I love to stick my long slender bill into flowers to suck the nectar.			
8	 I have big eyes and feathers that look like little horns. Find me asking “who” everyone is!

1	 I hang out in trees in the park or your backyard. I have a bushy tail. I love to nibble on acorns and perform acrobatic tricks.			
2	 I'm a large, peaceful creature that sometimes has antlers. Find me in forests and open meadows.			
3	 I'm a small, furry mammal that builds dams and lodges. Look for my home near streams and ponds.			
4	 I'm a large mammal with hooves and a mane. Look for me grazing in grasslands and meadows.			
5	 I'm a small furry animal with long ears and a bushy tail that hops around gardens and fields, nibbling on plants.			
6	 I'm a large, intelligent marine mammal, often spotted along the coast. Look for me swimming and splashing in the waves.			
7	 I'm a tiny creature with whiskers and a tail, scurrying around fields, yards, and even inside homes.

Clue				
1	 Look for me buzzing around flowers, searching for nectar. I'm a common insect that pollinates plants and makes honey.			
2	 Spot me in the daylight as I flutter by with colorful wings. I bring beauty to the surroundings, especially around plants.			
3	 Find me by lifting rocks or logs. I'm a small critter with many legs, often scurrying around in dark places.			
4	 Listen for my chirps at night — I'm a nocturnal creature. Search for me on warm summer evenings, creating a gentle melody.			
5	 In lakes and rivers, you'll discover me swimming gracefully. I have a shell on my back and am known for a slow and steady pace.			
6	 Explore rocky landscapes and gardens where I may be hiding. I'm a slender reptile, known for my quick movements and long tail.			
7	 Near ponds and streams, where the water's edge meets the land, look for me. I'm a small amphibian with a smooth, moist skin and a distinctive croak.

2	 <p>Find me along the coasts or near large bodies of water, where waves crash against my shores. I am a strip of land kissed by the sea, providing habitats for diverse marine life.</p>			
3	 <p>I carve my path from high places to the sea, through valleys and canyons. I am a ribbon of life, winding across the terrain, nourishing the land as I flow.</p>			
4	 <p>Look up in the sky and spot me drifting by. I come in various shapes and sizes, creating beautiful formations high above.</p>			
5	 <p>After the rain has ceased, search the sky for a colorful arch. I appear when sunlight meets raindrops, forming a vibrant spectacle.</p>
